YOUR STAY INCLUDES

- Complimentary breakfast of warm mpunga phala (rice porridge) made with nutritious groundnut flour every morning or upon request.
- Drinking water, Tea and coffee always available in our shared dining area
- A guided introduction to the HeR Liberty team, the school project, the youth hub and farming projects on arrival.
- Laundry, please add any dirty clothes in the laundry basket in the bathroom and give it to Felia, our house Keeper to get it washed.

MEALS DURING YOUR STAY

- Lunch or dinner is not provided at the house, but you are welcome to use the kitchen to cook your own meals
- Explore Zomba town to have a meal at the restaurants around
- You may ask Felia (our housekeeper) to prepare a local meal for you at a cost of MWK 5,000 per person.

Learn to make this beloved Malawian street snack with a local woman-led cooking group. You'll mash, mix, and fry your own batch to taste!

Get hands-on with vibrant chitenje fabric. Guided by local youth entrepreneurs, you'll design and sew a simple, stylish tote bag to take home.
